#### Our Mission Statement


#### Stimulate the mind

# A Typical Day

07:30	Early arrivals, breakfast and free play
09:00	Morning welcome time
09:15	Free-flow – choice of activities
10:00	Morning snack bar opens
11:30	Circle time in key groups
12:00	Lunch time!
12:45	Sleep/rest time
13:00	Activities resume
14:00	Afternoon snack bar opens
15:00	School day ends, activity change
16:00	Afternoon tea
16:45	Story time, quiet activities
17:00	Free play
18:00	Nursery closes

Children are encouraged to visit the toilet according to their individual needs. Nappies are checked and changed at regular intervals.

Babies under the age of two will follow their own routine, which carers will be made aware of.

# Curriculum

# The learning opportunities we provide

At Little Explorers Nursery and Preschool the children follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum. The children are constantly encountering new experiences and seeking to



understand them in order to extend their skills, develop their confidence and build on what they already know. The foundation stage is continued in reception classes in primary school. The foundation stage is based on seven areas of learning which are:

#### The Prime Areas of Learning Personal, Social and Emotional Development.

This area of learning is about emotional well-being, knowing who you are and where you fit in and how to feel good about yourself. It is also about developing respect for others, social competence, and a positive attitude to learn.

#### Communication and Language.

The ability to communicate gives children the capacity to participate more fully in society. We will help your child to learn to talk confidently and clearly, enjoying stories, songs, and rhymes. They will learn to link sounds with letters, develop writing skills, and become familiar with books.

#### Physical Development.

The children will learn to improve skills in

co-ordination, manipulation, and movement, develop a positive sense of well-being and begin to recognise the importance of keeping healthy. They will have access to enjoy outdoor play in our fantastic garden area and frequent access to equipment to enhance their gross motor skills indoors.

# The Specific Areas of Learning Literacy

The children will learn to link sounds with letters, develop writing skills, and become familiar with books and text.

#### **Mathematics**

Your child will develop an understanding of mathematics through counting, sorting, matching, seeking patterns and making connections. We will encourage learning about numbers, shapes, space, and measures through games and activities.

#### Understanding the world

Children in this area of learning are developing skills and understanding that help them to make sense of the world around them. This forms the foundation for later work in science, history and geography. They will find out about

past events in their own lives and those of their family. They will also find out about different cultures and beliefs.

#### Expressive Arts and Design

Children will be encouraged to express their thoughts, ideas, and feelings, imaginatively using a wide variety of different materials and equipment including sand, water, paint and music.

#### **Fully Inclusive**

Paid sessions are fully inclusive of meals, nappies, milk, food, nappy cream & sun cream. Please ask us if you'd like to know the brands we use.

#### Ad-hoc hours

Additional hours outside the sessions shown can sometimes be accommodated, at a rate of £7.60 per hour.

A minimum of two sessions per week are required.

# Age 3-4 years

Free Entitlement: Little Explorers offer 11 funded hours per week, 51 weeks of the year.

11 hours of funding is divided pro rata over the term and, if you have selected additional hours outside of the funded schedule, will be incorporated in your monthly invoice.

#### Free Snack included

Meal fees apply for AM funded sessions (see opposite)

Consumables are charged at a fixed rate of £3 per hour during free entitlement funded hours.

#### Additional Funding for Working Parents

This additional funding for eligible parents is available in the following patterns:

To receive the full 22 funded hours, the remainder of the additional AM or PM session must be paid at the hourly rate of £7.60, plus a meal fee.

# Other notes on our fees

These apply to all ages, with or without funding.

- A registration fee of £50 is due when registering your child. Please speak with the manager if you require assistance with this payment. This is voluntary for funded-only places.
- Sibling Discount A discount of 10% is available when two or more siblings attend at the same time, from the same family unit. Discount will be given to the sibling paying the lowest rate, for fee paying children only. No discount applies if Free Entitlement Funding is used to cover fees of one or more children.
- Fees are collected one month in advance, before the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month; any additional costs will be added to the following month's invoice. Fees may be paid monthly using bank transfer or with cash.
